I have a child in both reception and year 6 and feel at the moment happy to send my year 6 child to school but unsure about my reception child as they may be unable to social distance themselves. I feel that I won't be able to make a decision though until closure to June to see how matters progress with the virus. I would like my year 6 child to get the chance to return though to get some closure and to be able to say goodbye to their friends, teachers and staff before moving onto to senior school.

Other schools have been providing packs that you collect every Friday ready for the following week and you hand in the work from the week before for marking. This would have been great!! The work we have completed ourselves has been posted onto the class dojo portfolios, and there has been no feedback on the work! Really poor!

Thank you for all the kind words and care for our safety as well as your own. It has been lovely to see so many positive and helpful comments, which have all been shared with staff and have been considered as part of our back to school plan.

Thank you for your feedback. We would have appreciated knowing this earlier so that we could have provided further support or assistance and addressed these concerns. Staff have been in school and available at the end of the phone to improve your experience. However, this has been fed back to staff and I hope that you notice a difference in the coming weeks.

I appreciate that some parents may have preferred to receive the printed packs we provided prior to lockdown. However, we as a school strongly felt that following the Government Lockdown guidance to 'Stay at home, Protect the NHS, Save lives' meant that providing work packs would not have been following this rule. The advice was clear that only 'essential' journeys should have been made and limited contact with other people should be adhered to at all costs; having parents visit school week on week to collect packs of work would have increased traffic in and around school and on the roads, therefore increasing risk of infection. Now that the Government have eased these rules, as of the 1st June work packs will be available at the beginning of each week for the children in years 2, 3, 4 and 5. Please collect from the school office during normal school hours. Please DO NOT come and collect these if you can continue to use the online resources which will remain in place for the foreseeable future.
