Splendid Skies Year 1 & 2

Geography



Name, locate and identify the 4 countries of the UK.

Year 1 & 2—Use basic geographical language to refer to key physical and human features, including: beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, season and weather (link to a beach in each of the 54 countries) Use a simple map with symbols for a key to show 4 countries and physical and human features.

Use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and geographical features (link to a beach in each of the 4 countries)

Y1&2- identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK and the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles - create own weather maps or weather reports

Identify the similarities and differences between the local environment and one other place - compare climates to another place, also look at examples of extreme weather conditions in a non-European country

Identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense.

Year 2
