DSL (Designated Safeguarding Leads)

The DSLs meet weekly, every Monday morning, to discuss any reports or concerns that have occurred and to look at any support needed for the week ahead.

They also keep up-to-date by attending regular training, including DSL training, refreshers and termly DSL network meetings. Each half term, the DSLs and the school's safeguarding governor meet. The agenda includes training, reviewing policies and to ensure everyone is constantly up-to-date and safeguarding procedures are being followed.

Training included, supporting children exposed to domestic violence, awareness of FGM, vulnerability and sexual exploitation and safety.



DOMESTIC ABUSE

Witnessing and experiencing domestic abuse Domestic abuse always has an impact on children. Being exposed to domestic abuse in childhood is child abuse.

Children may experience domestic abuse directly, but they can also experience it indirectly by:

- · hearing the abuse from another room
- seeing someone they care about being injured and/or distressed
- finding damage to their home environment like broken furniture
- being hurt from being caught up in or trying to stop the abuse
- not getting the care and support they need from their parents or carers as a result of the abuse
