Thank you to those of you who either attended the consultation event, emailed your questions or asked one of the senior leadership team questions about the conversion. The main theme from this was around the uniform and name of the school. I confirmed that the name of the school won't change and that we will become Aqueduct Primary Academy. The projected conversion date is the 1st April and lots has been happening in the background to finalise legal arrangements and begin to future plan which is very exciting.

When we return to school on the 8th April we will officially be 'Aqueduct Primary Academy'.

Attendance

As always our attendance is a focus and we have made the updated policy available for you on our website. attendance-punctuality-policy-2023-2024.pdf (aqueductprimary.co.uk) We have also created an easily accessible 'Attendance Leaflet' which can be found in the 'Parents & Carers' section of the website.

We continue to track the number of pupils who have lower attendance and these are conversations that your child's class teacher will be having with you again at parental consultations.

Last term we had 52 children who are currently on 100% for the year so far. The class with the best attendance across the term was 4JC And they have received a voucher for £20 to spend on whatever they like as a class.

Our aspirational attendance target remains at 96% with children very keen to be the best class each week. (National attendance sits at around 94%)



Uniform

We have noticed that there is an increasing number of children who have returned to school after the Christmas holiday wearing incorrect uniform. The teachers regularly remind children and yourselves about the correct uniform so we thought another reminder would be beneficial.

- Only logo jumpers and cardigans should be worn. A plain red jumper or a jumper of any other colour is not in our policy and therefore not part of our agreed uniform.
- * Shoes should be worn on non PE days Black Trainers are not classed as shoes.
- PE kit comprises of a plain red T-Shirt with blue or black plain jogging bottoms or shorts. <u>Jogging bottoms with patterns and</u> writing on are not part of our uniform.
- * Trainers must be worn on PE days. We advise that another pair of footwear is also brought to school so that if their trainers get wet or muddy, they have a change of footwear and don't have to tread mud in the classroom or just wear their socks.
- The sports logo t-shit and zip training top can be worn on PE days but these remain optional in addition to the required PE kit mentioned above.
- * As the weather begins to get warmer, red gingham or black school dresses can be worn with black or red tights. Please note grey is not part of the agreed uniform.
- Only stud ear-rings should be worn and these are removed or covered up on PE days for safety. No rings or necklaces should be worn.
- We are aware (and thank you to those parents who have communicated with us) that some girls wear black leggings. These are considered suitable as long as they are black, good quality material and not see through and that they are coupled with the white top and logo jumper or cardigan and shoes. We recognise that these are more comfortable and as long as they are smart are considered a suitable alternative to trousers.

We as a school have always tried to support parents to access our uniform. At the beginning of each academic year we hold a swap shop so that parents can access good quality second hand uniform. These are always checked and washed by us and it is difficult to notice that they are second hand.

We thank the parents who have approached us with questions or requests for support to access uniform and have provided many of our families access to jumpers, cardigans, PE kit and shoes.



A Parent's Guide to Cyberbullying












Many young people who are victims of cyberbullying suffer in silence.
