A message from the teachers

Welcome back! It is great to be back at school for our last half term of the academic year!

This half term we are focusing on the school value of kindness. With this in mind the children have started their new half term by looking at what kindness means to them. We then considered what kindness looks like, feels like and sounds like.

Let's enjoy this last half term together children and make it a good one!

Our Learning This Half Term

Throughout this half term, the children will be starting a new topic in Science—Sound. They will look at:

- Identifying how sounds are made, associating some of them with something vibrating.
- Recognising that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the ear.
- Finding patterns between the pitch of a sound and features of the object that produced it.
- Finding patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it.
- Recognising that sounds get fainter as the distance from the sound source increases.

In our history lessons this half term, we will continue learning about The Iron Age, having already learnt about The Stone Age and Bronze Age.
