Thank you for everyone for the positive return to school following the easter break. We were so pleased to see that everyone was so well rested and happy to be back.

Our school value this half term is 'Happiness' a wonderful value for all to show and the children have definitely been showing this value in bucket loads since being back at school.

Attendance

Last term we had 27 children who are currently on 100% for the year so far. The class with the best attendance across the term was 4JC. And they have received a voucher for £20 to spend on whatever they like as a class.

Our aspirational attendance target remains at 96% with children very keen to be the best class each week. (National attendance sits at around 94%)

Mobile phone reminder

- Plain jumpers and cardigans are not part of our policy and will continue to be asked not to be worn and the rest of the uniform expectations remain unchanged.
- * From September 2024 all reception pupils and new pupils joining the school will be expected to wear the new logo uniform.

Books Home (frequently asked question)

Your child may seem to bring home a book that you feel is too easy or that you feel they have bought home for a while or before. The reason for this is, the reading practice they get at home is focused on building their fluency (speed) of reading and ensuring they are comprehending the meaning of the text.

Children will feel proud to read to you and you can enjoy listening as their reading develops.

The decoding, phonics and blending is taught in reading lessons.

Whole Class Reading

Whole class reading happens four times a week from year two to year six. These lessons are based around high quality texts, selected carefully to inspire each age range and are by a range of different authors. During these lessons, our pupils develop their fluency and comprehension skills and are immersed in language rich vocabulary.

Reception and Year one <u>have</u> phonic/reading lessons five times a week. They also have afternoon sessions focusing on their phonics. Books that they bring home to read link to the sounds that they have been learning, and repeatedly reading the book that includes these sounds increase the fluency.

Lessons are planned to ensure children have opportunities to read aloud in class and read with a partner whilst being taught strategies to read with fluency and enjoyment.

Love Reading

At Aqueduct Primary Academy, we strongly believe that reading is the foundation to all learning. We also believe it should be enjoyed and promoted. For this reason, reading is a key priority in our school and lies at the heart of our curriculum. We aim for all of our children to become fluent readers who can fully comprehend texts and learn to love reading.

The staff are excellent advocates for this belief, which is why we are always reviewing how we can develop our reading offer.

Reading Records

Reading Records will continue to come home for parents, older siblings, grandparents etc. to make comments when your children read at home. There will be weekly information in them to inform parents of the books the children are reading in school. However, reading in school will focus around shared texts and the learning linked to these. This will not be logged in the Reading Records



Our Reading Commitment

- · We have extended our Guided Reading lessons.
- Children have extended time to read quality texts.
- Story time in all classes every day
- Parents will be informed of the books the children are reading in their lessons.
- Increased opportunities for children to be reading to others

Reading Spines

In addition to encouraging pupils to read often, we are also passionate about our pupils reading widely and therefore, each class has a set of 'reading spines'. Class reading spines include a series of high-quality texts, which vary in author and genre and feature an array of key themes. Staff share these with the children regularly throughout the school year.
